her neck flows like a lily, expectantly.


She'll take her hair down when we come. She will open her arms to receive us.

Luis Guerra is a painter and sculptor who divides his time between Real de Catorce, San Luis Potosí, and Austin, Texas. His paintings and sculptures are in public and private collections in the United States and Mexico, including the Snite Museum of Art at the University of Notre Dame (South Bend, Ind.), the Wittliff Collections at Texas State University (San Marcos), and the San Antonio Museum of Art. A mural he created with his students at Austin Community College is on permanent display at the Northridge Campus Library.

Guerra has won awards in major juried exhibitions, including the Siqueiros-Pollock Award from the Museo de Arte de Ciudad Juárez (of INBA, the Instituto Nacional de Bellas Artes). His artwork has also been featured in numerous publications, including the series on Chicano art published by Bilingual Press. Guerra is a storyteller as well. He narrated his stories, "Cuentos de la Sierra," on National Public Radio's Latino USA for two decades, since the program began, in 1993.

Guerra was born in Piedras Negras, Coahuila, and raised in Laredo, Texas. He has a BFA from the University of Texas at Austin and a Master's in Education from Antioch College in Yellow Springs, Ohio. In 1984, he went to Japan and Korea, where he studied aikido and immersed himself in sumi-e and Zen calligraphy.
