STRENGTH FOR TODAY

"Strength for today and bright hope for tomorrow,"

So the words of the old hymn go. Many of the great, familiar hymns have heart-wrenching stories behind them of suffering, miraculous provision, and perseverance. But the author of this hymn, Thomas Chisholm, led a remarkably unremarkable life, in a variety of commonplace occupations, and spent his last days in the Methodist home for the Aged in New Jersey. He wrote this now-beloved hymn out of a realization that God was at work in the common, the mundane, the ordinary.

That is what Lent calls us to do - to strip away the frills, the drama, the distractions that occupy so much of our time so that we might see God working. The main call, and the first word spoken over us in Lent is the word "remember." On Ash Wednesday we are told, "Remember you are dust. And to dust you shall return." We are called to remember our own mortality.

But along with that comes another remembering. A remembering that draws us along the lenten journey to Easter. We are called to remember God's faithfulness, God's greatest acts of love and mercy to us while we were yet sinners.

This year's Lent devotional guide centers on the actions of remembering, repenting, and returning, that we might at last rest in the sure and certain knowledge of God's goodness and the hope of the resurrection.

We invite you to use it with friends, family, roommates, Formation Groups, or individually. There is space next to each day's readings and prayers to write a brief note about where you saw God's hand at work that day (a great way for children to participate). Remember, it doesn't have to be earth-shattering. The Lord is present in the most basic, the common, and the ordinary in the most powerful ways.

Join us this season in stripping away all that which blinds us to the presence of God, that we might truly see him in his resurrection power and glory on Easter.


