



OLD TESTAMENT READING

GENESIS 22:1-3, 6, 7-13

After these things God tested Abraham and said to him, "Abraham!" And he said, "Here I am." 2 He said, "Take your son, your only son Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains of which I shall tell you." 3 So Abraham rose early in the morning... 6 And Abraham took the wood of the burnt offering and laid it on Isaac his son... 7 And Isaac said to his father Abraham, "My father!" And he said, "Here I am, my son." He said, "Behold, the fire and the wood, but where is the lamb for a burnt offering?" 8 Abraham said, "God will provide for himself the lamb for a burnt offering, my son." So they went both of them together.

9 When they came to the place of which God had told him, Abraham built the altar there and laid the wood in order and bound Isaac his son and laid him on the altar, on top of the wood. 10 Then Abraham reached out his hand and took the knife to slaughter his son. 11 But the angel of the LORD called to him from heaven and said, "Abraham, Abraham!" And he said, "Here I am." 12 He said, "Do not lay your hand on the boy or do anything to him, for now I know that you fear God, seeing you have not withheld your son, your only son, from me." 13 And Abraham lifted up his eyes and looked, and behold, behind him was a ram, caught in a thicket by his horns. And Abraham went and took the ram and offered it up as a burnt offering instead of his son.

EPISTLE READING

ROMANS 4:13, 16-21

For the promise to Abraham and his offspring that he would be heir of the world did not come through the law but through the righteousness of faith...

16 That is why it depends on faith, in order that the promise may rest on grace and be guaranteed to all his offspring—not only to the adherent of the law but also to the one who shares the faith of Abraham, who is the father of us all, 17 as it is written, "I have made you the father of many nations"—in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist. 18 In hope he believed against hope, that he should become the father of many nations, as he had been told, "So shall your offspring be." 19 He did not weaken in faith when he considered his own body, which was as good as dead (since he was about a hundred years old), or when he considered the barrenness of Sarah's womb. 20 No unbelief made him waver concerning the promise of God, but he grew strong in his faith as he gave glory to God, 21 fully convinced that God was able to do what he had promised.

Reader: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark.

MARK 8:22-25, 29, 31-38

And they came to Bethsaida. And some people brought to him a blind man and begged him to touch him. 23 And he took the blind man by the hand and led him out of the village, and when he had spit on his eyes and laid his hands on him, he asked him, "Do you see anything?" 24 And he looked up and said, "I see people, but they look like trees, walking." 25 Then Jesus laid his hands on his eyes again; and he opened his eyes, his sight was restored, and he saw everything clearly...

29 And he asked them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter answered him, "You are the Christ."... 31 And he began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes and be killed, and after three days rise again. 32 And he said this plainly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. 33 But turning and seeing his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan! For you are not setting your mind on the things of God, but on the things of man."

34 And calling the crowd to him with his disciples, he said to them, "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. 35 For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and the gospel's will save it. 36 For what does it profit a man to gain the whole world and forfeit his soul? 37 For what can a man give in return for his soul? 38 For whoever is ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of him will the Son of Man also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels."



(PLEASE KNEEL OR BE SEATED)

Celebrant: All glory be to you, O Lord our God, for you created heaven and earth, and made us in your own image; and, of your tender mercy, you gave your only Son Jesus Christ to take our nature upon him, and to suffer death upon the cross for our redemption.

> He made there a full and perfect sacrifice for the whole world; and did institute, and in his holy Gospel command us to continue, a perpetual memory of his precious death and sacrifice, until his coming again.

For in the night in which he was betrayed, Jesus took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat, this is my Body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." Likewise, after supper, he took the cup; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink of this, all of you; for this is my Blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you, and for many, for the remission of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

Therefore, with these your gifts which we now offer you, we your people, celebrate and make the memorial your Son has commanded:

When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup, we proclaim your Death, until you People: come again.

Celebrant: We humbly ask you, O merciful Father, to hear us, and, with your

Word and Holy Spirit, to bless and sanctify these gifts of bread and wine, that they may be unto us the Body and Blood of your dearly-beloved Son Jesus Christ. Accept this, our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, through which we offer to you our selves, our souls and our bodies. Grant that all who partake of this Holy Communion may worthily receive the most precious Body and Blood of your Son Jesus Christ, and be filled with your grace and heavenly benediction; that Christ may dwell in us, and we in him.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever.

People: Amen.

Celebrant: And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say:

People: Our Father, who art in heaven, Hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come,



WE COME TO HIS TABLE

ALL SAINTS WELCOMES ALL BAPTIZED CHRISTIANS TO PARTICIPATE IN THE EUCHARISTIC MEAL. THIS INCLUDES ALL CHRISTIANS, WHETHER MEMBERS AT ALL SAINTS OR ANOTHER CHURCH. CHILDREN WHO HAVE BEEN BAPTIZED AND ADMITTED TO THE TABLE BY THE ELDERS OF THIS CHURCH OR THE LEADERSHIP OF ANOTHER CHURCH ARE ALSO WELCOME TO THE TABLE.

The ushers will guide you to the communion line. Each row will be released to form one line in the middle of the sanctuary. Sections 1, 2, 3, and 4 will take communion in the front while sections 1B, 2B, 3B, and 4B take communion in the back.

When you get to the front of the line, you'll see a stack of communion trays to your left and to your right. Those seated on the left-hand side of the sanctuary will go to the left and those seated on the right-hand side will go to the right.



ALTAR TABLE TIPS



1. WAIT FOR AN USHER

An usher will release each row. If you're not sure where to go, your usher will direct you.

2. GLUTEN FREE

Gluten Free bread is located in the cups of the center ring of each bread tray. If you need Gluten Free bread but the center cups are all gone, please indicate to the server at that station and he or she will replace the tray.





3. WINE & JUICE

Grape juice is located in the cups of the center ring of each wine/juice tray. If you or your child need juice instead of wine but the center cups are all gone, please indicate to your server and he or she will replace the tray.

4. CHILDREN

Children who have been interviewed by an elder or pastor at All Saints or by the ruling body of another church are welcome to partake of communion. If you think your child is ready and would like to schedule an interview, visit allsaintsaustin.org/eucharist for more information on the process.



PLEASE TAKE ONE CUP FROM THE FIRST STACK OF TRAYS CONTAINING BREAD. THEN, PROCEED AND TAKE A CUP FROM THE NEXT STACK OF TRAYS CONTAINING WINE AND JUICE.

When you have your two cups fill in the next available spot on the communion rail (no need to kneel), consume the elements, deposit your used cups in the rack at the end of the communion rail, and return to your seat.
