



(PLEASE KNEEL OR BE SEATED)

Celebrant: We praise you, O Lord, that you, rich in mercy and infinite in goodness, made us in your own image, freed us from everlasting death, and provided our redemption in your only and well-beloved Son, whom out of love you gave to be made man, like us in all things but sin, to receive the punishment of our transgression in his body, to satisfy your justice by his death, and through his resurrection to destroy him who was the author of death; and so to bring again to the world the life from which the whole offspring of Adam was exiled.

And so, at the commandment of Jesus Christ our Lord, we present ourselves at this, His table.

For in the night in which he was betrayed, Jesus took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat, this is my Body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." Likewise, after supper, he took the cup; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink of this, all of you; for this is my Blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you, and for many, for the remission of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

Therefore, we proclaim the mystery of faith:People:Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.


Celebrant: The Gifts of God for the People of God. Take them in remembrance that Christ died for you, and feed on him by faith, with thanksgiving.

WE COME TO HIS TABLE

All Saints welcomes all baptized Christians to participate in the eucharistic meal. This includes all Christians, whether members at All Saints or another church. Children who have been baptized and admitted to the table by the elders of this church or the leadership of another church are also welcome to the table.

The ushers will guide you to the communion line. Each row will be released to form a line in the middle of the sanctuary. Sections in the front half of the sanctuary will take communion in the front while sections in the back half will take communion in the back.

When you get to the front of the line, you'll see a stack of communion trays to your left and to your right. Those seated on the left-hand side of the sanctuary will go to the left and those seated on the right-hand side will go to the right.



ALTAR TABLE TIPS

1. WAIT FOR AN USHER

An usher will release each row. If you're not sure where to go, your usher will direct you.

2. GLUTEN FREE

Gluten Free bread is located in the cups of the center ring of each bread tray. If you need Gluten Free bread but the center cups are all gone, please indicate to the server at that station and he or she will replace the tray.





3. WINE & JUICE

Grape juice is located in the cups of the center ring of each wine/juice tray. If you or your child need juice instead of wine but the center cups are all gone, please indicate to your server and he or she will replace the tray.

4. CHILDREN

Children who have been interviewed by an elder or pastor at All Saints or by the ruling body of another church are welcome to partake of communion. If you think your child is ready and would like to schedule an

Please take one cup from the first stack of trays containing bread. Then, proceed and take a cup from the next stack of trays containing wine and juice.

WHEN YOU HAVE YOUR TWO CUPS TAKE THE NEXT AVAILABLE SPOT AT THE COMMUNION RAIL, CONSUME THE ELEMENTS, DEPOSIT YOUR USED CUPS IN THE RACK AT THE END OF THE COMMUNION RAIL, AND RETURN TO YOUR SEAT.


