



CHARGE AND VOWS FOR DEACON

My brothers, every Christian is called to follow Jesus Christ, serving God the Father, through the power of the Holy Spirit. God now calls you to a special ministry of servanthood directly under your elders. In the name of Jesus Christ, you are to serve all people, particularly the poor, the weak, the sick, and the lonely.

As a deacon in the Church, you are to study the Holy Scriptures, to seek nourishment from them, and to model your life upon them. You are to make Christ and his redemptive love known, by your word and example, to those among whom you live, and work, and worship. And you are to interpret to the Church the needs, concerns, and hopes of the world.

It is also your duty to develop the grace of liberality in the members of the church, to devise effective methods of collecting the gifts of the people, and to distribute these gifts according to the purposes for which they are contributed. At all times, your life and teaching are to show Christ's people that in serving the helpless they are serving Christ himself.

Minister: Do you believe the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments, as

originally given, to be the inerrant Word of God, the only infallible

rule of faith and practice?

Candidates: I do.

Minister: Do you sincerely receive and adopt the Confession of Faith and the

Catechisms of this Church, as containing the system of doctrine taught in the Holy Scriptures; and do you further promise that if at any time you find yourself out of accord with any of the fundamentals

of this system of doctrine, you will, on your own initiative, make known to your Session the change which has taken place in your views

since the assumption of these vows?

Candidates: I do and will.

Minister: Do you approve of the form of government and discipline of the

Presbyterian Church in America, in conformity with the general

principles of biblical polity?

Candidates: I do.

Minister: Do you accept the office of deacon, and promise faithfully to perform

all the duties thereof, and to endeavor by the grace of God to adorn the profession of the Gospel in your life, and to set a worthy example

before the Church of which God has made you a deacon?

Candidates: I do.

Minister: Do you promise subjection to your brothers and sisters in the Lord?

Candidates: I do.

Do you promise to strive for the purity, peace, unity, and edification of

the Church?

Candidates: I do.

accordance with the teachings of Christ, so that you may be a

wholesome example to all people?

Minister: Will you be faithful in prayer, and in the reading and study of the

those in need?

Candidates: I will.

and receive these brothers as deacons, and do you promise to yield them all that honor, encouragement, and obedience in the Lord to which their office, according to the Word of God and the

constitution of this church, entitles them?

Minister: My brothers, may the Lord by his grace uphold you in the service he

lays upon you.

PRAYER FOR DEACONS

Minister:

Eternal and ever-blessed God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ: of your infinite mercy you have chosen for yourself a people, the Church, whom you uphold by your Holy Spirit, yet have chosen to use the service of men and women in leading and serving your flock. For these gifts of leadership and service, we are profoundly thankful.

Now we ask, O Father, that you set apart these servants to the work to which they have been called. Through Jesus Christ your Son, give them your Holy Spirit; fill them with grace and power, and make them deacons in your Church. Richly bless them with heavenly wisdom. Grant them your grace that they may be godly men, full of the Holy Spirit and of faith. Fill them with wisdom, that they may lead well, in your faith and fear. Fill them with compassion, that they may faithfully serve those who are in need. Fill them with devotion to your Church, which you love and for which your Son gave his life, and to her mission to proclaim the risen Christ among the nations.

Guide them and sustain them in all their service until their work on earth is done, and then bestow upon them the great rewards of your heavenly kingdom; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

READING FROM THE ACTS OF THE APOSTLES

ACTS 4:3-13; (24-31)

And they arrested them and put them in custody until the next day, for it was already evening. 4 But many of those who had heard the word believed, and the number of the men came to about five thousand.

5 On the next day their rulers and elders and scribes gathered together in Jerusalem, 6 with Annas the high priest and Caiaphas and John and Alexander, and all who were of the high-priestly family. 7 And when they had set them in the midst, they inquired, "By what power or by what name did you do this?" 8 Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, "Rulers of the people and elders, 9 if we are being examined today concerning a good deed done to a crippled man, by what means this man has been healed, 10 let it be known to all of you and to all the people of Israel that by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead—by him this man is standing before you well. 11 This Jesus is the stone that was rejected by you, the builders, which has become the cornerstone. 12 And there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved."

13 Now when they saw the boldness of Peter and John, and perceived that they were uneducated, common men, they were astonished. And they recognized that they had been with Jesus...

(24... "Sovereign Lord, who made the heaven and the earth and the sea and everything in them, 25 who through the mouth of our father David, your servant, said by the Holy Spirit,

"'Why did the Gentiles rage, and the peoples plot in vain?

26 The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers were gathered together, against the Lord and against his Anointed'—

27 for truly in this city there were gathered together against your holy servant Jesus, whom you anointed, both Herod and Pontius Pilate, along with the Gentiles and the peoples of Israel, 28 to do whatever your hand and your plan had predestined to take place. 29 And now, Lord, look upon their threats and grant to your servants to continue to speak your word with all boldness, 30 while you stretch out your hand to heal, and signs and wonders are performed through the name of your holy servant Jesus." 31 And when they had prayed, the place in which they were gathered together was shaken, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and continued to speak the word of God with boldness.)

People: It is right to give him thanks and praise.


Celebrant: It is very good and right, our duty and privilege to at all times and

Celebrant: With these angelic powers, O Lord, lover of mankind, we also cry and say: holy are you, Lord, and all-holy, you and your only begotten Son, and your Holy Spirit; and magnificent is your glory; for you so loved the world that you gave your only-begotten Son that whoever

gifts of bread and wine. Make this bread also the precious Body of your Son, and that which is in this cup His precious Blood. Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit; so that they may be unto us nourishment of soul, fellowship with the Spirit, and a foretaste of your kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is

yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever.

Celebrant: The Gifts of God for the People of God. Take them in remembrance


that Christ died for you, and feed on him by faith, with thanksgiving.

WE COME TO HIS TABLE

ALL SAINTS WELCOMES ALL BAPTIZED CHRISTIANS TO PARTICIPATE IN THE EUCHARISTIC MEAL. THIS INCLUDES ALL CHRISTIANS, WHETHER MEMBERS AT ALL SAINTS OR ANOTHER CHURCH. CHILDREN WHO HAVE BEEN BAPTIZED AND ADMITTED TO THE TABLE BY THE ELDERS OF THIS CHURCH OR THE LEADERSHIP OF ANOTHER CHURCH ARE ALSO WELCOME TO THE TABLE.

The ushers will guide you to the communion line. Each row will be released to form a line in the middle of the sanctuary. Sections in the front half of the sanctuary will take communion in the front while sections in the back half will take communion in the back.

When you get to the front of the line, you'll see a stack of communion trays to your left and to your right. Those seated on the left-hand side of the sanctuary will go to the left and those seated on the right-hand side will go to the right.



ALTAR TABLE TIPS



1. WAIT FOR AN USHER

An usher will release each row. If you're not sure where to go, your usher will direct you.

2. GLUTEN FREE

Gluten Free bread is located in the cups of the center ring of each bread tray. If you need Gluten Free bread but the center cups are all gone, please indicate to the server at that station and he or she will replace the tray.





3. WINE & JUICE

Grape juice is located in the cups of the center ring of each wine/juice tray. If you or your child need juice instead of wine but the center cups are all gone, please indicate to your server and he or she will replace the tray.

4. CHILDREN

Children who have been interviewed by an elder or pastor at All Saints or by the ruling body of another church are welcome to partake of communion. If you think your child is ready and would like to schedule an interview, visit allsaintsaustin.org/eucharist for more information on the process.



PLEASE TAKE ONE CUP FROM THE FIRST STACK OF TRAYS CONTAINING BREAD. THEN, PROCEED AND TAKE A CUP FROM THE NEXT STACK OF TRAYS CONTAINING WINE AND JUICE.

WHEN YOU HAVE YOUR TWO CUPS TAKE THE NEXT AVAILABLE SPOT AT THE COMMUNION RAIL, CONSUME THE ELEMENTS, DEPOSIT YOUR USED CUPS IN THE RACK AT THE END OF THE COMMUNION RAIL, AND RETURN TO YOUR SEAT.
